Things to know before attending a COLLEGE FAIR:

College Fairs are an extremely effective way to gain more information about a variety of colleges and universities. Here are some helpful hints to make a college fair more productive and informative.

*If possible register with the college fair so that your information can be electronically shared with schools you are interested in. If this service isn't available, then create a set of self-stick labels with your name, address, email address, year of graduation, and possible area of study. This speeds up the process of filling out inquiry cards allowing more time to talk to the rep. NOTE: Even if you have already filled out an inquiry card do it again. Many schools keep track of the number of contacts with them over time as an indication of your interest level.

*Take notes and gather business cards, or put their contact info in your phone (or take a picture of their business card). Bring something (notebook or electronic device) to take notes as you speak with the rep. Most likely the rep you are speaking with is the one who will be working with you throughout the process so get to know them. If you have more questions later, contact the rep. *Remember contact with schools is important.*

*Be open minded about other colleges. This is a great opportunity to pick up information and learn about unfamiliar institutions that may be a good match for you.

*Keep in mind that many selective colleges & universities cannot provide minimum or preferred test scores or GPA averages since their selection process is based on many factors.
